There are a number of things you can do to bump up your blog. First, which I think most of us have probably done already, is make sure the privacy settings are set so that your blog is searchable in different search engines. If it's not, tags like 'noindex' or 'nofollow' are typically attached to your site through the back end making it harder to find.

You can also register your site through Google Search Console. This basically places a mark on your blog, indexing it within their system as an actual site, not just mumble jumble spam.

And one more, is keep sharing your site. The more traffic through your site, the more it is deemed "important" by Google. So I know you share it on Twitter already, and are near the top of the search

website. Or if you share videos on your blog from YouTube, make your YouTube search settings more open.

Now this is actually the last one... Add, or continue to add, lots of links and pingbacks! The more links you have, the stronger your site becomes, because you're making more connections from your blog.

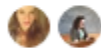
